	<p>Sue introduced Adalberto, Program Outreach Specialist, and recommended for Consortium members to connect with Adalberto to start building internal process and pathways.</p> <p>Professional Development (PD) Summary</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Good attendance; there was representation from each Consortium member. • Survey results discussed, including providing more breaks and ending sooner. • Part 2 PD is tentative for March 6, 2019 and will probably be held at ATAP, Creek Side, or Quail Hill Community Center. • It was suggested to include counselors • Recommended to meet prior to the next PD because meeting every six months is not enough, tentative planning meeting was set for November 25, 2019. 	
	<p>B. Member share out regarding carry over and fund expenditure</p> <p>Majority of the Consortium members had carry over</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CCA had about \$75,000 carry over, but the funds will be spent and there was also a miscommunication with the financial department. • IVUSD had about \$6,772 carry over due to book purchases. • IVC had about \$423,420 carry over. • LBUSD had about \$54, 869 carry over, but is confident that the amount will be spent. • SC had about 2 million carry over, but it will spend by June 2020. It is currently spending 2018-2019 funds. Sue is chairing hiring committees to staff all sites, including Program Assistant, Office Assistant, Admissions and Records Specialist, Lab Assistant, and Program Student Support Specialist. It was noted that one year worth of allocations was saved for a facilities project, but it was recommended not to spend. Also, the Adult Education program costs twice as much as what CAEP allocates. SC is scheduled to spend funds on OASIS capital project. • TUSD had about \$266,745 in carry over, but it will spend the funds on digital technology, books, etc. Also, TUSD lost some of its teachers.
